Dear AHPRA and CMBA members,

The following is my submissions in response to the consultation draft standards proposed by the Chinese Medicine Board.

Proposed Grandparenting Standard

I do not agree with the proposed grandparenting standard.

- 1) I strongly oppose any grandparenting standard that operates to retrospectively prevent current practitioners from states outside Victoria from registering to practice.
- 2) The proposed grandparenting standard is completely at odds with the objectives and concerns underpinning the AHPRA scheme.
- 3) The Grandparenting standards with a cut off date of 31 Decmber 2007 will cause considerable hardship to Advanced Diploma graduates and students.
- 4) The December 2007 cut off date for Advanced Diploma graduates was practised in the transitional scheme in Victoria – the only state where Chinese Medicine is regulated. The application of the same cut off date nationally unfairly disadvantages those living outside Victoria.
- 5) The prior to 2008 condition required of Advanced Diploma practitioners under the Grandparenting standards predates the existence of the regulation. Its retrospective nature is subject to legal challenge.

Recommendations:

- 1) I recommend that the pre-2008 condition be removed from Advanced Diploma holders be allowed to register without restrictions or conditions under the Grandparenting scheme.
- 2) I recommend that the transition period be extended to enable current Advanced Diploma students who complete their qualifications up to 30 June 2017 to register under the Grandparenting scheme.
